



EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN (EMT) TRAINING

An Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) is a person who has been trained to render immediate care for the sick and injured. The job of an EMT is multifaceted, presenting numerous challenges in a variety of emergency environments. An EMT may work on an ambulance or in a hospital emergency department. An applicant for an EMT training course must be at least eighteen years old and have a high school diploma or the equivalent. High School subjects recommended for persons interested in becoming an EMT are driver education and health and science courses. Armed forces medic training is also considered good preparation for prospective EMTs.
